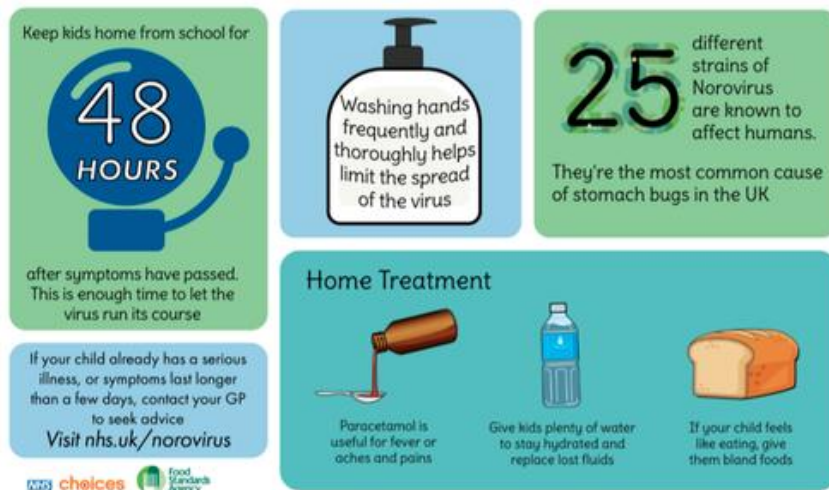
School News

We have had a number of children off with sickness bugs recently.

A reminder that pupils must be free from symptoms for 48 hours before returning to school.

Diarrhoea and vomiting in children

There's no specific cure for stomach bugs such as **Norovirus**. See tips to reduce the spread and treat symptoms

A reminder that we have one week left of this half term. Friday 13th February is the last day of school. Pupils return to school on Monday 23rd February.

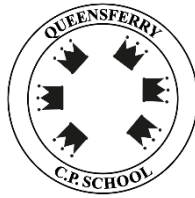
